

Lt. Q a few questions and some are real doosies.







How long have you been in law enforcement? This month marks my 20th anniversary with the OCSD.

What was your job before being a deputy sheriff?

Before becoming a deputy, I worked at my parent's ARCO AM/PM gas station in South Central Los Angeles.

Have you ever had to pull your gun out of holster?

I have pulled my gun out of my holster several times and luckily have never had to pull the trigger.

Ever taser anybody?

Yes, several. When tasers were first introduced in the field, I was the first deputy in OCSD to deploy a taser on a violent person that was extremely intoxicated.

Have you ever received a ticket? *No.*

In law enforcement, what was your best day?

I have had many great days, my best was graduating from the OCSD Academy. Despite my parents wanting me to be in a safer, more traditional job such as a doctor, lawyer, accountant, I could see my parents were proud of me for choosing a life of public service.

In law enforcement, what was your worst day?

My worst day happened this year. I was with a father of a 13-yearold missing girl and we discovered that she committed suicide at a nearby park. Having four kids of my own, it struck me really hard. I felt I failed this father by not finding his daughter safe and bringing her back to him.

Do you have any tattoos? *No.*

What was your favorite toy growing up?

My favorite toy was my Optimus Prime Transformer!

Have you ever been tasered?

Yes. I volunteered to be tased for 5 seconds as part of a training exercise. My biggest fear was that I would scream like a little kid. I was told by my peers the secret was to exhale before the "ride" and it worked!

Have you ever been arrested? *No.*

What's the best piece of advice you've been given?

From some senior sergeants: "Take every call for service seriously and remember, you are dealing with people having possibly the worst day of their life. Ask yourself, 'Did you do everything you could have done? Did you go above and beyond?' That advice is now the advice I give to all of our deputies in Mission Viejo.

Among the many professional people who opened businesses and practices and bought homes in the early days of Mission Viejo, none had a better reason to locate on historic rancho land than **Dr. Roger Guevara.**

Dr. Guevara moved with his family to this newly developing community in 1968, becoming the second physician and first obstetriciangynecologist to open his office here – across from Mission Viejo High School.

During the 30-year career that followed, Dr. Guevara delivered more than 10,000 babies,

including the Whistler triplets in 1972 – the first triple birth that occurred in South Orange County.

Among **Dr. Guevara's** ancestors was **Jose Ortega**, the scout who passed through this area with **Gaspar de Portola** during the first Spanish exploration of California.

After his death in 1998, the City of Mission Viejo honored him by changing the name of the one-block extension of Medical Center Road to **Dr. Guevara Way** which leads to the hospital where he had practiced.

LOOKING FOR LOVE


Dear Aunt Sandy,

The REAL HISTORY of the San Juan Capistrano Airport

Most people have not been in the area long enough to remember, but there used to be an airport in South Orange County that was lost forever due to tragedy. Originally built in the 1931 in a nearby location, it was relocated and rebuilt again in the 1960's. The airstrip was located at the end of what



where the **Coach House** is located. It had a 1,400-foot dirt runway and a few small buildings. In the end, 85 planes would call the tiny airport home. There were a number of

squabbles and conflicts politically and otherwise. After clearing all of those hurdles, other problems

is now called Camino Del Avion, near

Any trace of the airport is gone began to surface.

Eventually, tragedy struck on Memorial Day weekend in May, 1977. A pilot who did not have a commercial flying license lied to the owner of a company which flew large advertising banners behind planes up and down the coastline. The plane he was flying was towing a large banner and crashed shortly after takeoff. A young 5 year-old girl was riding a bicycle along a path bordering San Juan Creek and was struck by the plane's propellor and died.

A month after the accident, the airfield was ordered to be shut down as details of the crash emerged. The airport was closed in 1978. Now, all that remains is the road leading to the airport, Avenida Aeropuerto, and the street where the runway once laid, Calle Aviador.

NEXT STOP: MISSION VIEJO METROLINK IS STILL THE BEST VALUE IN TOWN

Almost 30 years ago, the City of Mission Viejo initiated an effort to

construct a train station in Mission Viejo. The original site considered for the station back in 1990 would have taken out the MV Library (now the Rock Youth Center) and surrounding buildings. Although it had many positive features, due to concerns about the




residential nature of the site (noise and lack of potential for surrounding commercial development) as well as traffic congestion, ultimately it was not selected. Several sites within Mission Viejo were given serious consideration, but each hit roadblocks. In the end, only the joint site with Laguna Niguel could be brought to fruition.

Although sharing a station with Laguna Niguel wasn't the City's first choice, it has worked out well and Mission Viejo pays only 50% instead

of 100% of the annual maintenance costs.

Today, residents can ride the train all weekend for as little as \$10. Next time you'd like to beat the traffic down to San Diego, just stop by the Mission Viejo/Laguna Niguel Station and ride the train.

The steepest street in Mission Viejo is **San Gonzalo**. This beautiful and peaceful street used to be the site for numerous skateboard races and some unfortunate accidents. At the bottom end of San Gonzalo it intersects with Puerta Real and Granada Park.

While skateboard champions were made on San Gonzalo, it also has had it's share of disasters, such as the time a young boy on

a bicycle could not stop on the steep and treacherous street and crashed head-

on into a car and died. More than a few times, brakes have failed on vehicles and sent them flying into trees in El Dorado park and left one lady paralyzed for life.



San Gonzalo also has the honor of

being the home for Mission Viejo's one verified California Coastal Redwood, reaching up high over the neighborhood homes.

Next time you take a sightseeing tour of Mission Viejo and are near San Gonzalo, make sure you get your brakes tested first.



Did you know in the shopping center where **Trader Joe's** stands today on Marguerite Parkway there was a roller skating rink? It was called **Skateway** and was very popular year round in the 70's and 80's.

Did you know Mission Viejo had three locations of horse stables? The first one was at the end of the cul-de-sac on Trabuco Circle where

the tennis center parking lot is now located. The second, and largest, was located near Marguerite and La Paz where the Ralph's Center is located. President Ford's son kept his horse there and when he would ride, he was followed around by the Secret Service. The third stable was located near Saddleback College where the animal facility is now located.


