### Have you ever had to perform the Heimlich?


No, we have never had to perform the Heimlich here at Capo, but Yes I have had to use the maneuver in my job before Capo.

When the kids decided letting smoke bombs off was hilarious! THAT STUNK!


### What food do you like the least to prepare?

### Mission Viejo's Favorite Mail Carrier

For the 30 years, Mission Viejo postman Jay Waterman has been delivering mail to homes in Mission Viejo, 20 of those years have been to the same neighborhood. Meet Jay Waterman. Jay is a proud Native American from the Mohawk tribe. It's easy to spot Jay with his doo-rag and tribal tattoos.



Jay makes about 475 stops a day in his trusty old mail truck. He knows about everybody, and enjoys stopping, chatting and listening to his customers

when he can squeeze in the time. Often, he's offered water, pizza and hot dogs and many other things along the route.

The **Mission Viejo Reporter** asked Jay if he's ever been bitten by a dog as a postman. He said "only once". One time, a dog burst though a screen door and sunk it's meat-eating fangs into Jay's arm. He had to go to the doctor for a precautionary tetanus shot. Jay said, "Getting the shot hurt more than the bite."

For the last 19 years, Jay has been driving the exact same postal truck and he loves it. It has become part of him; he knows every little nuance of the truck.



Each postman at the Mission Viejo Post Office is required to do six mandatory movements at each stop:

- 1. Take off seat belt.
- 2. Put in Park.
- 3. Put on emergency brake.
- 4. Take keys out.
- 5. Turn wheels to curb.
  - Carry satchel to porch to use as guard if necessary.

### SPEED HUMPS OR SPEED BUMPS

Q: The crazy teenagers drive too fast down the street. How can I get speed bumps installed?

All the following conditions are required per the City of Mission Viejo's Speed Hump Policies, Guidelines and Procedures.

- 1. Obtain signatures of 67% of street residents indicating support.
- 2. Street segment must be at least ¼ mile long.
- 3. Legal speed limit is 25 mph.
- Radar survey shows more than 15% of motorists exceed 32 MPH.
- 5. Paved width is 40 feet or less.
- 6. Street shall be no more than one lane in each direction.
- 7. Average traffic volume greater than 2,000 vehicles per day.
- 8. Street has grade of 5% or less.
- 9. Roadway must have adequate sight distance.
- Orange County Fire must approve.

### P DEAD CROWS THE FAST, SAFE AND FUN WAY

virus is transmitted to people and animals through the bite of an infected mosquito. Mosquitoes acquire WNV when they feed on infected birds, and then pass the virus along when they bite humans.



Birds testing positive for West Nile virus are good indicators that the disease is present in the neighborhood. Residents are encouraged to report dead birds to Vector Control for testing.

The bird must be dead for less than 24 hours. If you are not sure if the bird you have found has been dead less than 24 hours before, look for the following clues:

- 1. The bird should not be stiff.
- 2. There should be no ants or flies covering the bird.
- 3. The bird should not have a foul odor.

In addition, the bird should be intact.

- a. No missing body parts
- b. No physical injuries
- c. Eyeballs must be intact (disease testing require bird eye fluid)

### Use caution if you must handle a dead bird:

- Do not touch dead birds with your bare hands.
- Wear gloves or use a stick to pick the bird up.
- Do not eat while handling the bird.
- Double bag the dead bird by placing it into one plastic bag and then placing that bag into another plastic bag.
- Wash your hands with soap and warm water IMMEDIATELY after handling the bird.

### A WHISTLE STOP THIS SIDE OF HEAVEN NAMED GALIVAN

Just south of today's Oso Parkway and Cabot Road was the whistle stop siding called **Galivan**. This train stop was used for transporting crops, cattle and other freight. Galivan became a daily stop for the Santa Fe in 1922. It was four miles (six minutes) from El Toro and five miles (eight minutes) from San Juan Capistrano. This stop is said to be named for a prominent Santa Fe engineer, **J.B. Galivan**.

For many years, the Santa Fe would whistle when it had something or someone to drop off at Galivan, as well as stopping there if anyone was "flagging" to be taken aboard.

**DEFINITION:** A flag stop, or whistle stop is a stop or station at which trains respectively stop only on request, that is, only if there are passengers or freight to be picked up or dropped off.



Nermine Morcos-Clark - Pick it up! And spend it! Haha.





Located in the heart of the city but also in a place where few know exactly where, is our sewer system. In charge is long time **Santa Margartia Water District** employee and MIT graduate **Ron Johnson**. Along with Ron are his crew members Nick Salb and Jeff Sprueill.

This elaborate system at the Oso Creek Water Reclamation Plant brings

all of the bathroom debris to a special location here in the city where is it cleaned, separated and convert into reclaimed water used for irrigation. This facility is absolutely spotless and smells terrific! The **Mission Viejo** 

Reporter asked Mr. Johnson, "How is it that there is no terrible smell although all the water is a churning dark brown color?" He replied, "We keep massive amounts of air and movement injected into the water."

### COLFERS EXPERIENCE WILD KINGDOM MOMENT



Chanel, who works at Nordstrom in the makeup section, was returning back to work from a break. She saw Jonathan with the woman sitting on the edge of the parking structure with her feet hanging out of the structure. Chanel heard the woman tell Jonathan she wanted to die and heard Jonathan trying to convince her to not kill herself.

### **HOW THE YMCA GREW IN MISSION VIEJO**

The original Mission Viejo Recreation Centers were built to have a place for Mission Viejo kids to be active. The Marguerite facility was very large, and in 1993, the City discovered that the recreation center was losing money. The **Saddleback YMCA** existed at the time, but had no facility. They ran Indian Guides & Child Care programs out of a store front office building on La Paz Road.

Around that time, one of the YMCA board members, Rick Murray, was having lunch with Bill Craycraft, the Mayor at the time, and Bill was mentioning the cost of operating the recreation centers. Rick said he had the solution: The YMCA would take over the Marguerite Center on a 15 year lease for \$1 per year and save the City hundreds of thousands of dollars per year. In December of 1994, the YMCA signed an agreement with the City, and soon Saddleback YMCA moved into half of the Marguerite Recreation Center.

The YMCA became hugely successful, and membership grew, and along

the way, new programs for children and adults were created.

Fast forward to 2004, Chuck Costello & Rick Donahue negotiated a 30 year lease extension, and the YMCA changed its name to the Mission Viejo YMCA and will be part of the City's history forever.


