STOP! Do not react immediately. Wait for a few moments or force yourself to revisit the situation later. THINK about your choices and the consequences of each choice.

ACT responsibly and carefully.

REVIEW your action to determine if it was a good choice or not.

Parents and grandparents can teach the S.T.A.R. process to their children to provide them with a tool which may help them to resist peer pressure and to make better choices. But the tool is also helpful for adults too! The philosopher, Seneca, once stated, "Most powerful is he who has himself in his own power."

EIVI **CLINT EASTWOOD COMES TO TOWN**

Swallow's Inn has been called a dive bar, a cowboy bar, and many other names. It's an eye-opener for non-locals. Bras hang from the ceiling, pictures of naked men and women are posted in the restrooms, and eye-catching signs greet visitors who come to drink, karaoke, dance, play shuffleboard and listen to live bands. This bar exudes personality, so much so that Clint Eastwood selected it for a locale in his 1986 movie Heartbreak Ridge.



Not every bar allows patrons to buy \$1 bags of peanuts and throw the shells on the floor. Not every bar has stories about horses entering the premise. Clint Eastwood was looking for a

rough-and-tumble tavern where the superstar actor/director could shoot a bar scene for Heartbreak Ridge, he went straight to the Swallows Inn in San Juan Capistrano.

Despite the tavern's location

(in sight of the 18th-Century mission that gave the town its name) and its serenely evocative moniker, the Swallows Inn is just what no-nonsense Clint was seeking. The free-wheeling saloon, a local landmark for about 100 years, sports a lively crowd comprising local cowboys, Marines from nearby Camp Pendleton, a sprinkling of bikers, and curious tourists drawn by the bar's rowdy reputation.

FROM OUR DROPPING STUFF IN THE LAKE DEPT.



Lake Mission Viejo opened its doors in April of 1978. In October 1978, Dave Kerr started working as a Life Guard at the lake. Dave has seen it all over the last 39 years. One of his most memorable Lake moments was in 1980 when he personally placed 700 stoves in 45 different piles under the lake.

Here's the story: In the late 1970's, the Mission Viejo Company, while building homes all



over Mission Viejo, discovered that the new avocado green Amana Dual Oven Ranges that were being installed were faulty and could catch fire. In the interest of safety, they removed these 700 stoves from the homes, and then had to destroy them.

Someone heard that Lake Mission Viejo bass love the nooks-and-crannies that these Amana Range's provided. The stoves were loaded onto trucks, driven to the launch area, placed upon electric boats, taken out to specific locations throughout the lake, and dumped overboard.


Enter Dave Kerr. Dave, wearing his tight-fitting scuba-diving suit, went down and strategically placed 45 piles of these 700 stoves on top of each other, three high, in the shape of an "L".

Today, at certain times of the year, when the water is clear, you can see Dave's handiwork from the surface. Thanks to Dave, bass and catfish call these Amana Dual Oven Ranges their home. The Mission Viejo Reporter asked Dave if he ever gets overcome with the sentimental


urge to dive-down and check out his masterpiece arrangement he created almost 40 years ago. Dave said, "No, not at all."

brick lined tunnels under the trackage are located just over the Mission Viejo border in Lake Forest. Technically, it isn't a "public road" according to one of the yellow signs near the southbound approach, but anyone can still drive through it if you dare.

Every so often, motorists get stuck, forgetting about just how tall their vehicle stands. Last time, it was a rental truck that



Rumored to be the lowest railroad crossing over a street in California, the tunnel on Ridge Route and Jeronimo is pretty scary. Amtrak and Metrolink whiz by at 90 MPH only fifteen feet above the street.

The tunnel is only 91 Inches high. These twin, single lane,



became stuck, and just before Lake Forest city workers were to begin cutting the vehicle out with a blowtorch, a six-year-old suggested they just let the air out of the tires. The truck just slid right out.

BARCELONA WALLS OD OLD MISSION VIEJO ARCHITECTURAL STYLINGS

This subtle architectural feature has been around since the early days of Mission Viejo, but you might not have noticed it.

The "Barcelona Walls" were placed as entrances as part of the Mission Viejo Company's Master Plan at key intersections throughout the community.

They all feature curving brick walls with a ball on their top and were based on a Southern Spain aesthetic. The architectural style in

this part of Spain is a blend of architectural styles: Spanish, Moorish and Rustic, similar to Tuscany in Italy.

These walls will remain as they are, as they are part of the heritage of the community.





owned as a (much) younger man.

Now she's prettied up inside and out, with a candy root beer gloss that accentuates her classic body. She has taken a lot of Glen's attention; his wife nicknamed her "The Other Woman", but Glen has no plans to get rid of her (the car or the wife!).

Glen started the transformation of the Mercedes in 1988, but put his project on hold while taking care of the usual family and career responsibilities and getting kids through college. He restarted the project once again twenty-one years later in 2009. Those intervening years gave him the opportunity to plan the modifications and customizing touches that would make her look and act the way he wanted.

The final result includes the 'built' Chevy 350 engine and 700-R4 trans, Mustang II front suspension, 1967 Camaro taillights, Jaguar power side mirrors, Maserati patterned leather on Honda seat shells, and Harley Davidson turn signal indicators on the custom wood dash. These sycamore trees and monument (Located in Sycamore Park) mark the area of an adobe house built in the 1840's by Jose Serrano, whose Rancho de los Alisos greeted stage riders. The stage road followed the old Spanish "El Camino Real". This peaceful glen was a welcome stop for travelers.



1889. He will always be remembered as one of the largest landowners of the area, the Don of Rancho Niguel.

Today, the Aliso Creek Bikeway runs through the heart of Mission Viejo from South Laguna to Rancho Santa Margarita along an 18.5-mile corridor. The trail features plenty of rest areas and kiosks providing information and recounting the area's history. Beginning from the ocean, the trail goes gradually uphill finishing at Cooks Corner.



Just under the freeway from Sycamore Park is the site of the Juan Avila Adobe marker. During the years after gold was discovered Avila would sell cattle for beef to the miners headed north. Don Juan was noted for his kindness and would always offer his adobe to travelers on the El Camino Real. Juan Avila died in San Juan Capistrano in


Dear Lonely in Mission Viejo,




PURPLE HEART: Being wounded or killed in any action against an enemy of the United States...


The Purple Heart is a United States military decoration awarded in the name of the President to those wounded or killed while serving, with the U.S. military.

The Mission Viejo Reporter first heard the






