

Mission Viejo's unique streetlight the experts said couldn't be done

ne of the most iconic images in all of Mission Viejo is the Mission Bell streetlight. The story behind it is so interesting we want to share it with you. In the 1960's when city founders designed the city, the recreation centers, the parks, the gently curved streets, they said, We need something else, something that's indictative to Mission Viejo.

Mission Viejo's bell shaped street lights where patterned after bells that were along the historic El Camino Real. El Camino Real is the road of the missions. All Father Junipero Serra's missions are along this highway, from San Diego to San Francisco, each about a days walk apart.

The Mission bell streetlights were fashioned from the El Camino Real Bells and a photograph of the Mission San Juan Capistrano Bells.

The idea for a bell started at the Mission Viejo Company, the experts said it would be impossible to create such a light. General Electric finalized the design and manufactured the streetlight. Walter Scott, of G.E. and Roy Dahlin, of the Edison Company, collaborated to create the light and scroll to match the proportion and color of the bell at Mission San Juan Capistrano. The name of the bell is Mission Bell Luminaire.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR**

Water Savings is one of the key City Strategies for 2016, and the City Council recently doubled its investment in a new, Intelligent Irrigation System for our City's parks, with a goal of saving over

30% on our park water use. In addition, the City applied for grants that covered almost 45% of the total cost of the new system. This will lead to a payback for Mission Viejo of under 20 months. Once the payback is complete, we will reap the benefit of this strategic water decision for decades to come.


The water savings will be substantial. In general, once the full system is in place in late spring, the City, over the next three years, will save a volume of water equal to a football field covered by water to a depth of over 800 feet!

The City has a couple of other water saving plans in place,

they will be made public in the next month or two. I will keep you posted as we work to totally change the culture of water management here in Mission Viejo.

## MISSION VIEJO GYMNASTS BRING HOME GOLD

Three Mission Viejo gymnasts travelled to Colorado Springs, CO February 5-7 to compete in the 28th annual Pikes Peak Cup. All three gymnasts joined their teammates to bring home gold and their season's best results.



Level 6 gymnasts Abby Owen and Zita
Conot won gold with personal best scores. Owen, a 5th grade student at Reilly Elementary, was rock steady on the beam. She scored 9.575 to secure the top spot on the podium. She was also strong in all events, to take third all around with a 37.750. Bathgate Elementary 4th grader, Zita Conot wowed the crowd on floor and won gold with a fantastic score of 9.825. She continued her success, winning silver on vault with a 9.550. Owen and Conot contributed to their team's combined success as well. The Level 6 team won gold and dominated with 21 top 3 finishes as well.



La Paz Intermediate 8th grader, Payton Burn had her best meet of her first competitive season. The Level 7 gymnast was outstanding on beam, winning gold with a 9.750. She took the top podium spot on floor as well with a strong score of 9.725. She won silver on vault (9.450) and the all around (37.125). Burn's high scores, combined with teammates Reagan McMahon and Jessica Wright's 7-top three finishes, led the team to the all around team gold medal as well.

Owen, Conot, and Burn all train 16 – 20 hours at Olympica Gymnastics. Their amazing hard work is paying off.

# G.I. Joe Search and Rescue Warriors of The Heart

Joe Le was an incredibly kindhearted individual who strived to bring enjoyment to the lives of others. Joe was a very bright young man, an aspiring graphic design artist who loved the outdoors. In April of 2011 Joe was hiking in the mountains



above Azusa, California, when he slipped and was swept away in the fast-moving water of a river that ran through the canyon. Emergency response personnel were unable to rescue him and, when their mission status moved from Rescue to Recovery, they were unable to locate his body.



The Mission Viejo based G.I. Joe Search and Rescue was started by Joe's sister, Mission Viejo resident Victoria Le. The mission of G.I. Joe Search and Rescue is to provide assistance & resources to both local authorities and families with missing loved ones. We are a self-activating team of search and rescue (S.A.R.) volunteers and we respond when notified

of an emergency rescue or recovery mission. We strive to prevent and assist in emergency rescue situations by preparing and training ourselves in survival and S.A.R. techniques, and

by educating the public on safety and survival procedures.

Since starting G.I. Joe Search and Rescue, our volunteers have been involved in situations very similar to Joe's and we have also responded to other emergency efforts elsewhere in the United States and abroad.



# **GRAFFITI CLEAN UP**

To you and I it's gibberish, but to some it's messages. That's why over 1,000 times a year, a select team of Mission Viejo staff members are ready to go to work at a moment's notice.

The Orange County Sheriffs Department contributes the city's lack of a gang presence partly due to the fact that we are very, very aggressive on graffiti.



The average citizen would probably not realize this due to a very aggressive graffiti removal program. Most graffiti is removed within 24 hours of being reported.

The single best deterrent for graffiti continues to be a fast removal



of the graffiti. All graffiti is photographed, plotted with GPS coordinates logged into a computerized program and monitored by our Orange County Sheriff Department.

# **Old MacDonald's Farm**

riginally, Old MacDonald's Farm opened at Knott's Berry Farm in January 1955. Operators of Old MacDonalds Farm, Fulton & Kay Shaw, left Knott's in early 1969 and moved their business to Mission Viejo, where they reopened in August. The location was once a small ravine located at Crown Valley Parkway and the



northbound entrance to the 5 freeway.

Years later, the Shaw's had a dispute with Knott's, which had continued to use the name "Old MacDonald's Farm" for their petting zoo. In the end, the Knott's version was renamed "The Animal Farm." The Shaws battled through some tough times, and finally the Old MacDonalds Farm closed in the late 70's. After closing, the only item that remained was the circular metal hitch from the pony ride. Needless to say, weeds and brush grew in that vacant lot, but the rusted metal hitch lasted until the Kaleidescope was built.

Hampton Inn & Suites is building a three-story, 101-room hotel on Marguerite Parkway, south of Avery Parkway. The hotel will be three stories high.


The proposed hotel's architecture will include a contemporary design, including tile roof materials, stucco walls, trim, and color selection.

# The Zika Virus Update

In 2015 eight people died of West Nile Virus in Orange County and 377 people were infected, one from Mission Viejo. The new problem on our hands is the Zika Virus.





#### The Zika Facts

- Zika virus is transmitted by Yellow Fever and Asian Tiger mosquitoes. Both species are now found in Orange County.
- A strong correlation has been made to microcephaly (small head size) in newborn infants
- The World Health Organization has declared a "Public Health Emergency."
- There is no cure for Zika. Mosquito breeding source elimination and bite prevention is the only way to prevent the spread of this virus.
- Mosquito control is a shared responsibility. Every resident must redouble their efforts to eliminate ALL standing water from their property, including standing water found indoors.


