Lessons From The Chief

Every summer Mission Viejo residents look forward to outdoor barbeques. Summertime, however, also brings fire and injuries due to outdoor cooking.



TO KEEP YOUR SUMMER BBQs FROM GOING UP IN FLAMES

- Always keep the lid to gas grills open when lighting the grill.
- If the flames go out prematurely, turn the grill off and wait 5 15.
 minutes for gas to clear the area before relighting it.
- Clean the catch tray below the grill regularly, keeping grease in check.
- Be careful to keep sleeves away from the flames.
- Keep children and pets at least 3' away from the grill area.
- Keep a fire extinguisher close to your BBQ.
- If using charcoal, when finished let the coals cool completely and dispose of them in a metal container.
- · Place grill 10' away from combustibles.
- On combustible balconies, decks, and patios, use an electric grill or an LP gas grill with a container capacity of less than 2.5 pounds.
- Never leave the BBQ unattended while cooking.

Florence Joyner Park is located at the corner of Alicia & Olympiad Parkway. It just might be the most beautiful park in Mission Viejo. It is named after Florence Griffith Joyner who is considered the fastest woman of all time, because she set world records in 1988 for both the 100 m and 200 m that still stand today.

She grew up in the Los Angeles area, and attended Jordan High School and graduated from California State University at Northridge. After her Olympic career, Florence, her husband, and daughter moved to the **Canyon Crest** neighborhood in Mission Viejo. Florence died in her sleep at home at the very young age of thirty-eight.

A statue is dedicated to her in the park along with an area dedicated to all Olympians from Mission Viejo.





FROM OUR THIS AIN'T BROKEBACK MOUNTAIN DEPT.

HIKING SADDLEBACK

NOTHING LIKE A VIEW FROM THE TOP

The mountain with dual peaks, named because it resembles a riding saddle, has remained the major natural landmark of the area. The Saddleback name has been carried over to the local valley and both the school and community college districts, among other uses.



The two peaks came to be named individually - Santiago Peak, and Modjeska Peak (for the famous Shakespearean actress who settled in near by Santiago Canyon).

Santiago Peak, frequently referred to as Saddleback Mountain, is Orange County's highest point.

HOW TO GET THERE

From Alicia Parkway, head east through Mission Viejo. Follow Alicia Parkway to Santa Margarita Parkway and turn right. Santa Margarita Parkway will dead-end at Plano Trabuco Road, which will become Trabuco Canyon Road after making a hard left turn. Make a right onto Trabuco Creek Road, which will immediately become a dirt road that becomes progressively rougher before reaching the **Holy Jim Trailhead**. It is possible to get to the trailhead

in a 2WD passenger car, but you will have to be exceptionally careful.

4WD is recommended.

DISTANCE: 15.2 miles **ELEVATION GAIN:** 4000 ft

TIME: 8 hours

DIFFICULTY: Difficult

SEASONS: Spring, Fall, Winter, Summer

HELICOPTERS ARRIVE ON MELINDA



One of the major players in getting the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to choose Mission Viejo was Ziggy Wilczynski of the Mission Viejo Company. Ziggy's role was substantial, from the initial call to the Mission Viejo Company from the IOC, to the opening day ceremonies in August, 1984.

In 1981, the IOC had pretty much decided on Lake Castaic as the chosen venue for the

Ziggy, Olympic Race Day 1984 Olympic Cycling Event. It was at the last moment that the IOC took a small plane flight down the 5 Freeway looking once more for a suitable venue when the IOC executive informed the pilot to "go ahead and turn around". It was then that he looked out the window and asked "What is this community below us with all the wide streets and rolling landscape?" He was told by the pilot that it was the community of Mission Viejo. At once, a call was made to the then Mission Viejo Company, and the rest as they say... is history.

Ziggy Wilczynski 2016

When the Mission Viejo Reporter asked 95 year old Ziggy what he remembers about opening day that might be a little unusual. He said that one of his duties that day was to arrange for the landing of the helicopter that was transporting all the IOC

officials. Ziggy placed a large colored wooden Olympic ring sign (see picture) at the landing spot up on Melinda where homes are now built, then directed the helicopter to land. Ziggy was fortunate to meet many of the top officials of the IOC, as this was the very first event of the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.





We have inpavement detector loops buried in or under the roadway, on Marguerite, Alicia, Oso, quite a few others routes. These loops detect the presence

light, and thus can efficiently manage the allocation of green signal time to the corresponding direction. A timer is used

> as a default during times of very low traffic density and when traffic is at its highest. The sensor loops typically work in the same fashion as metal detectors, allowing sensed traffic to flow on our main arterials while holding cross traffic at smaller streets.

> According to Brett Canedy, Transportation Analyst at the City of Mission Viejo, "There are now 115 signals in the city's Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS). The synchronization completed may potentially reduce travel times by 22
