MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Our City will begin providing animal services to more than 300,000 residents in five South County cities on January 1, 2017. Laguna Hills and Rancho Santa Margarita are the latest cities to break away from the county animal shelter and join the Mission Viejo Animal Services Center, which has been serving our community for more than two

decades.

Our shelter is a pro-humane facility served by a small staff and dedicated volunteers who provide exceptional care for homeless pets. In 1995, the City of Laguna Niguel joined our animal control program and Aliso Viejo followed suite in 2009. Today, this facility serves about 210,000 residents and handles more than 10,000 calls for animal control each year. With Laguna Hills and Rancho Margarita coming aboard, our facility will be the second largest animal shelter in Orange County.

We are fortunate to have the nonprofit Dedicated Welfare Group (DAWG) serving our facility. This wonderful volunteer group raises money for the animals' medical expenses. Since 1995, DAWG has raised over \$1.3 million in direct support and care for critical animal needs.

I am so proud of the work our staff, volunteers and the members of DAWG do each and every day. There are so many successful pet adoption stories and the positive impacts those unions have had on countless families and

individuals. I am also proud of the cities of Laguna Niguel and Aliso Viejo for being great partners with us for many years and look forward to the expansion of our shelter and new partnerships with the cities of Laguna Hills and Rancho Santa Margarita.

How many Sheriff deputies watch over Mission Viejo at any given time?

ANSWER:

The City of Mission Viejo Police Services "fields" from between five and sixteen Deputies at any given time. It depends on the day of the week and the time of the day. The services also widely vary from patrolmen, to commercial vehicle enforcement, to motorcycle traffic enforcement to civilian traffic investigation / parking enforcement. Our City also fields civilian volunteers who are on the street performing vacation home checks, reporting graffiti and other issues that is concern for our citizens.

BLOCK HISTORY MONTH MISSION VIEJO SLUMP STONE BLOCK

Last month, the Mission Viejo Reporter wanted to get the whole story on our famous Slump Stone block. We called **Rick Muth** of **Orco Block** in Stanton. Three



generations of Muths have built company, block by block. In doing so they also helped build Mission Viejo – one 35 pound block at a time.

Homes were needed. And homes needed block walls, so the family invested in expensive block-making equipment. This caught the attention of Tony Moiso and the Mission Viejo Company. They wanted a company that could produce a block that was different



from all the rest – The Slump Block. But, as Rick Muth told us, "This type of block was difficult and messy to produce," but the Muth's said 'lt's something new, let's go for it!" The color was difficult, the style was

difficult, but

it became the signature stone of Mission Viejo. All the Barcelona Walls (entrances to Mission Viejo), all of our recreation centers, and numerous schools all used the Slump block. Rick told us that it became so popular that the block is now called – Mission Slump Block.

It's been confirmed last month's 20 acre brush fire near the Arroyo open space was caused by a titanium club at **Arroyo Trabuco Golf Course.** Evidently a rock got between the club and the golf ball. This summer fires broke out at two Orange County golf courses — one, at the Shady Canyon Golf Club in







Irvine, and the other at Arroyo Trabuco Golf Course. "Each golfer had used titanium-plated three irons at the course before the fire," said Orange County Fire Authority Captain Steve Concialdi."

Concialdi said the fire department is asking golfers using titanium-coated clubs to move their balls away from rocks and dry

vegetation and onto the irrigated fairways. "Talk about a hazard," said Concialdi. "We are looking at a severe fire season because of the drought, and no one should take chances with titanium clubs on dry ground.

FROM OUR PULLING THE PLUG DEPT. SCAM ARTIST **BEWARE OF UTILITY BILL SCAM TARGETING MISSION VIEJO CUSTOMERS**

Mission Viejo Police Services is warning residents and business owners to beware of a growing utility bill scam that continues to impact Mission Viejo.

These phone bandits call claiming to be from a local power company such as Southern California Edison (SCE). They paint a dire picture by saying your account is delinquent and unless you pay right away the service will be disconnected. The



fraudster demands you purchase a prepaid cash card for a specific amount of money and provide them with the card number.

Although just two incidents have been reported in Mission Viejo this year, we know others have been "hit". The victims either don't realize it or are embarrassed and don't report it.

"If you receive a call like this, remember to hang up and follow up," said Mission Viejo Crime Prevention Specialist Khatra Molina. "Contact your utility company using a phone number listed on your statement, not the phone number provided by the caller."

Your power company will never call you and threaten immediate service disconnection. A lengthy process takes place before the plug is pulled. Typically, multiple written notices are sent to the customer when the account is delinquent. The company will also never send an employee to demand money in person.

I'm gonna go out on a limb here and say that water should be a much bigger issue in California to the average voter. If you don't agree with me, take out your water bills for the last few years and look at them more

closely. Go ahead, I'll wait while you rummage through your desk drawers. Okay? See the increases? Huge, right? FROM OUR A LITTLE BIT OF MISSION VIEJO HISTORY DEPT. HOW THE YMCA ARRIVED IN MISSION VIEJO

The recreation centers were built to have a place for Mission Viejo kids to be active. The Marguerite facility was very large, and in 1993, the City discovered that the recreation center was losing money. The Saddleback YMCA existed but had no facility. They just ran Indian Guides & Child Care programs out of a store front office building on La Paz Road.

One of the YMCA board members, **Rick Murray**, was having lunch with **Bill Craycraft**, the mayor at the time, and Bill was mentioning the cost of operating the recreation centers. Rick said he had the solution: The YMCA would take over the Marguerite Center on a 15 year lease for \$1 per year and save the City hundreds of thousands of dollars per year. In December of 1994, the YMCA signed an agreement with the City, and soon Saddleback YMCA moved into half of the Marguerite Recreation Center.

The YMCA was very successful, and membership grew, and new programs for children and adults were created.

In 2004, Chuck Costello & Rick Donahue negotiated a 30 year lease extension, and the YMCA changed its name to the Mission Viejo YMCA and will be part of the City's history forever.

This masterpiece of a monument was built and designed by **Connell Design Group** in 2003 as a cell phone tower, but now has become so much more. Standing at over 60 feet and made of stone, wood and sweat-equity, it might be the most beautiful structure in Mission Viejo.

Folks come from all around to be photographed with this piece of history. It's rumored to be fashioned after the famous clock tower in the *Back to the Future* movies. Some say its identical, and others say it looks nothing like it. Other rumors say the arches were designed from building plans unearthed in San Juan Capistrano over a century ago. We may never know, but we all agree that it is a special piece of Mission Viejo architecture.
