


HOW THE CROW CAME TO BE BLACK

A Brule Sioux Legend

Told by Good White Buffalo, at Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota, 1964

The crow was pure white in the beginning. He was the brother to the buffalo. The Sioux needed the buffalo for food and skins, but everytime the Sioux would hunt the buffalo, the crow would warn him.

A hunting party gathered around the campfire to prepare for the hunt. A wise old chief said, "We must do something about crow. I will dress as a buffalo and when brother crow comes to warn the buffalo of our hunt, I will grab him."



crow came warning the buffalo. Crow was crying, "Caw, caw, caw, the hunters are coming to kill you!" The old wise chief jumped up and caught crow by his legs and tied them with a rawhide string and a stone so crow could not escape.

Later, as they sat in council the hunters asked, "What shall we do with this big, bad crow that has caused us to go hungry again and again?" Just then, an angry hunter grabbed crow and threw him in the fire. "This will teach you," he said. Of course, the string that held the stone burned through almost at once, and the big crow flew out of the fire, but, he was badly singed and some of his feathers were charred. Though he was still big, he was no longer white.

"Caw, caw, caw," he cried, flying away as fast as he could. "I'll never do it again; I'll stop warning the buffalo, and so will the crow nation. I promise. Caw caw caw"

Thus the crow escaped, but ever since, all crows have been black.

Mission Viejo Resident Designs City Seal

In April of 1989, the Mission Viejo City Council authorized Carl Glassford to design the City's logo. Carl was a Mission Viejo resident and an art director for Walt Disney Productions. The fee he charged was just \$750 dollars. This included three comprehensive design layouts with minor modifications, if required.

The dominant symbol chosen to represent the modern community was the Mission Bell Streetlight, and its ties to local history, set before the backdrop of landmark Santiago Peak.

In the middle, The Lake is displayed signifying outdoor activity.

At the left, is the "Rafter M" brand used for decades by Rancho Mission Viejo.

Balancing it to the right is a symbol of modern history-the Olympic torch. It was chosen because the cycling venue of the 1984 Olympic Games were in Mission Viejo.



The date of incorporation, 1988, is depicted as if it were branded on the land.

On May 5th, 2018, the Friends will be hosting a "Gently Used" Purse Sale, in the Saddleback Room at City Hall.






They have had all three of their kids grow up here and attend our public school system, which Mike loves.

The Mission Viejo Nadadores program has dominated the aquatic Sports scene since it's earliest days and brought Mission Viejo national attention in the public spotlight. Olympic Champions such as diving legend Greg Louganis, swimmers like Brian Goodell, Shirley Babashoff, Mary T. Meagher, Dara Torres and coaches like Mark Schubert and Ron O'Brien all come from the Nadadores.

In 1968 when the Nadadores team was formed, it was comprised of 25 swimmers who competed in local events. Six years later, in 1974, the Nadadores women won their first National Championship title.

Since that time, the Nadadores have won a total of 47 National Team Championships, 12 Olympic Gold Medals, 7 Olympic Silver Medals, 1 Olympic Bronze Medal, 5 Individual World Championship titles and 148 individual National Championships. The Nadadores have broken 91 American Records, 22 World Records and have produced more than 135 All-Americans.

The program's motto is a "Tradition of Excellence". As of January, work continues on the new Diving and Swimming Facility due to be completed later this year.

A Mission Viejo Nadadores trained swimmer or diver has represented the United States in every Olympic Games since 1976.

THE STORY OF THE MISSION SWALLOWS

The miracle of the "Swallows" of Capistrano takes place each year at the Mission San Juan Capistrano, on March 19th - St. Joseph's Day.

Each year the "Scout Swallows" precede the main flock by a few days, and it is their chief duty to clear the way for the main flock to arrive at the "Old Mission" of Capistrano.

With the arrival of early dawn on St. Joseph's Day, the little birds begin to arrive and begin rehulding their mud nests, which



rebuilding their mud nests, which The Mission Swallow's nests line the walls are clinging to the ruins of the old stone church of San Juan Capistrano. The arches of the two story, high vaulted Chapel were left bare and exposed, as the roof collapsed during the earthquake of 1812.



This Chapel, said to be the largest and the most ornate of all the missions, is the swallows' summertime home.

At the end of the Season, the swallows take flight again, and on the Day of San Juan, October 23,

they do a fly over of Mission Viejo before flying the 15,000 miles back to their wintertime home in Goya, Argentina.

Local Artist Makes Art Out of Dirt

Sapna Sareen, a Mission Viejo resident, makes beautiful sculptural pieces, usable clay bowls, cups, plates, vases, and bottles. The catalyst that sparked her interest in pottery making was a visit to a clay studio in India. Years later, she enrolled in a Saddleback pottery class, so she could experience the art of making her own creations. Most recently, she interned at the Irvine Fine Arts Center.

Her unique pieces are a labor of love. It takes a couple of weeks to finish a piece as it has "to be trimmed, dried, bisque fired, glazed and glaze fired". To her, the best part about pottery is "the unpredictability of what will come out of the glaze kiln".



The appeal of working with clay is that it's a "tactile medium that has immense possibilities of creating anything." As an added bonus, Sapna explains that "throwing pots on the potter's wheel is a very meditative process", which she highly recommends

to anyone in search of a new, soothing hobby.



LA PAZ ROAD BEFORE CONSTRUCTION BEGAN IN MISSION VIEJO

In 1964, my friends Hank Mills and Gordon Glattenberg and I began to put an extensive amount of time into photographing the San Diego Surf Line of the Santa Fe Railroad. It turned out to be a very good decision, because things were on the cusp of change. During the early summer, Hank noticed that trees were being cut down in that area, and construction activity was getting under way.

I later learned that I was witnessing the commencement of construction for the new city of Mission Viejo. It was

the beginning of the end for the old Orange County I had known as a boy. The photo was taken of a southbound San Diegan on July 2, 1964. The location was approximately where present day La Paz Road crosses over the the former Santa Fe tracks, now owned by Metrolink.

Today the city of Mission Viejo, with a population of around 95,000, occupies this entire area. It's name is interesting, because Viejo means "old" in Spanish, and the town is neither old nor does it contain a mission. For me, this area seemed like paradise, with its pastoral landscape. I am sure, however, that those who live in Mission Viejo today see what has been constructed there as their version of paradise in its own right, with beautiful homes in a nice setting with a great climate. Most of them probably have little or no knowledge of what the place used to be.





HIGH ABOVE MISSION VIEJO - A SPECIAL HIDDEN TRAIL


ake a one-mile hike along Mission Viejo's highest point. A hidden trail located at the top of Vista Del Lago leads to the Canaveras Ridge Walk Trail which takes you a notch higher overlooking most of Mission Viejo, neighboring Lake Forest, Irvine and a clear view out to the Pacific Ocean.





Access the trail at Casaveras and Vista del Lago. Look for a dirt path next to a streetlight. Follow the trail loop, and enjoy incredible views on both sides.

As recently as 18 months ago, a mountain lion was seen on the trail so be careful. If you do see one, stay calm - do not approach or run away. You can back away very slowly from them, but keep facing forward, don't turn your back towards them, and do not crouch or bend down. Give them room, and they are likely to leave you alone.

Recently, the school debate team competed at the Grossmont College Speech Tournament and placed 1st in the competition. The nationally




