uring the initial build out of Mission Viejo, scientists said they made significant discoveries among the thousands of fossils dug up in this area, including previously unknown species of whales, many in the backyards of our residents.

The first fossilized bone found in Mission Viejo (not the biggest), was found on Via Viento. As the first homes were being built, a roofer, who was also a part-time archeologist, noticed artifacts in the soil. Paleontologists were called, and all building was

terminated indefinitely. An Orange County ordinance and state law require that developers hire qualified archeologists and paleontologists to monitor construction likely to unearth fossils. When building homes and roads resumed, many homeowners found and kept fossils and bones that were in the streets or their yards.

The Mission Viejo Reporter visited the site of the first fossil find and shared the historic information with the lucky homeowners Gene and Rebecca Rodriguez. Gene and Rebecca have lived in their Via Viento home for over twenty years. When building a patio years ago, the Rodriguezes remember finding many bones, but thought they were from animals that more recently died.



at Ground Zero

The biggest fossil found was the whale skeleton discovered during the building of the Felipe Tennis center. A segment of that fossil is now on display in Mission Viejo at Chrisanta and La Paz Roads. The remainder of the complete fossil was transferred to the Los Angeles County Natural History Museum.



Located at the entrance of Arroyo Trabuco Golf Course is a California Sycamore Tree, the oldest tree in Mission Viejo.



Estimated by officials at over five-hundred years old and split by lightning almost fifty years ago stands one of three trees in the city that was not planted by man. All other trees throughout the city were planted by humans.

This tree has its own eco-system. While visiting this tree the **Mission Viejo Reporter** noted all the living things that make this tree their home, squirrels, birds, lizards, ants and even the dreaded termite.

General Manager Matt Dovovan said that once he saw his grounds crew working to clean up a fallen branch that looked broken and dead. He told them to leave it alone. Now years later, this branch from the same tree has taken root and is thriving.

Years ago, when this area was a rock quarry, a fireplace and picnic table were located under this tree for the comfort of the quarrymen at lunch.



The intersection that has had the most reported traffic collisions during a recent time frame is Alicia Parkway and Jeronimo Road. Alicia is a major thoroughfare thru our City and is used by a large amount of citizens to commute to and from work.

Our lengthy spine street, Marguerite Parkway, has the most traffic collisions (followed by Alicia). The collisions on Marguerite Parkway are spread along its length and not concentrated at one intersection.


Lynn Houchin and his 1951 Ford Deluxe

QUESTION FOR THE CHIEF :

What is the normal response time if I call the Sheriff to my home?

AB ANSWER:


All calls for service are categorized by priorities. **Priority 1** calls consists of crimes in progress, medical emergencies, hazards to community (fire or chemical spills) or injury traffic collisions. These calls allow for deputies to use lights and sirens (Code 3) . **Priority 2** calls would consist of welfare checks, suspicious activity, or non-injury traffic collisions or traffic hazards. **Priority 3** calls would be calls for service such as taking a report.

Response times vary based upon priority, time of day, day of week, and each call is taken on a case-by-case basis. Deputies must always drive with due regard to public safety regardless of the nature of the call.

Our deputies' response time to priority calls is under five minutes. The clock starts as soon as the Dispatchers receive the call and does not stop until the deputy arrives on scene.


